1.	<p>Attendance, Minutes of Previous Meeting</p> <p>Review of previous actions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Ongoing; A Biodiversity meeting (as part of the Ecological Management Plan) was held end of February 2016, report should be received by the end of April 2016. 2. Closed; 3. Ongoing; Rail investigation report will be issued to FCC in the week or so. Once issued will share with BCC and CLG. CLG to advise in advance of next meeting if they require someone from the rail to attend. 4. Closed; <p>Minutes accepted.</p>
2.	<p>Matters Arising</p> <p>Questions raised in advance of the meeting;</p> <p>Question raised; Have the hot testing results met the Environment Agency requirements for the incinerator to continue to be designated as an "energy recovery" type rather than a "disposal" type incinerator?</p> <p>Gillian Sinclair's response; Yes</p> <p>Question raised; Please can FCC confirm the actual intensity of the stack lighting in lighting units of "Candela"?</p> <p>Gillian Sinclair's response; 2000cd</p> <p>Question raised; At the last meeting there were some genuine concerns raised regarding the lack of background air quality monitoring carried out for the Environmental Assessment for the development. Clearly, it would not be possible to carry out background monitoring with the EFW plant operating. However, one of the main concerns regarding these types of development is the accumulation of contaminants (trace organic compounds and metals) in soils and uptake into the food chain. Given the absence of background air quality monitoring data, would FCC be willing to carry out a long term soil monitoring programme. For example, this could include monitoring of contaminants at a number.</p> <p>Gillian Sinclair's response;</p> <p>FCC will not be undertaking back ground monitoring. The reasons for this have been discussed previously and FCC's position has not changed.</p>

	<p>Jez Elkin - Waste Awareness / Education Manager</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Management of Visitor Centre; available for visits by schools, community organisations, higher education colleges. • School visits will include site tour along designated route including control room, education about the EfW process and also activities based on waste reduction, reuse and recycling. • Community group (adult) tours will be along more extensive designated routes • We will also run public open days, possibly bringing in local organisations. • The centre is available for local groups to book as meeting space, 8.30am to 5pm, and can be flexible with evening and weekend bookings. • The visitor centre is on the third floor, is fully accessible and has an interactive tv screen, projector, as well as kitchen and toilets. It can cater for 50 visitors in the centre, and 30 for tours. • The role also involves outreach to schools, community organisations, community events etc, promoting waste awareness. (reduce, reuse, recycle) • There is no charge for schools and local community organisations to use the Visitor Centre. <p>Question raised; Whole plant could have been greener – alternatives considered. FCC employee will you present plan in a negative plant how you going to accommodate such views?</p> <p>Jez Elkin’s response; the post does not simply promote the EfW. Though employed by FCC the Education Manager is working in close partnership with BCC and has a remit of waste awareness using the waste hierarchy. Activities carried out both at Greatmoor and in outreach will focus on waste reduction, reuse and recycling as well as energy recovery.</p> <p>Rail HS2</p> <p>Sarah Gillie- the South Regional Planning & Permit Manager</p> <p>Sarah showed a presentation of the HS2 proposal for the sidings.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Reload the sidings to opposite side and an overhead bridge. <p>Rail Study – import waste by rail</p> <p>HH WTS bulking then transported by road to EfW, decisions taken and then we can’t suddenly move infrastructure. To issue to the CLG, can county council planners attend the next meeting to confirm if report accepted.</p> <p>Question raised; Have FCC considered investment over the duration of the contract.</p> <p>Sarah Gillie’s response; FCC need to be transparent.</p> <p>Question raised; Can a mobile receptor be put on the stack.</p>

	<p>Gillian Sinclair's response; FCC cannot add anything on the stack and roof for 2 years but can consider beyond this. Defect liability period needs to be completed.</p> <p>Action: GS to send a route map of copper and fibre ducting.</p> <p>Question raised; HGV's turning up an at Brackely lane – damage verges etc. What else can FCC to do to keep vehicles away from Edgcot.</p> <p>Gillian Sinclair's response; All waste delivery drivers shown the route, all maps have routing maps attached. Signage on A41 to stay no access to landfill site, no access to HGV's to Calvert. FCC to to speak to the highways people.</p>
3.	<p>Site Report <u>Greatmoor</u></p> <p>Hot commissioning tests and passed.</p> <p>Visual inspection; period wear and tear have been in line with expectations, completed tube thickness testing etc. alignment of grate needed had some movement so realignment work undertaken.</p> <p>Recommended operation of the EfW, the external ICI agree and monitors the construction progress HZI, FCC and BCC, they decide if we move from construction to operation.</p> <p>-</p> <p>No change in operations and operating at full capacity 900t per day = 37.5t and electricity export above guarantee levels.</p> <p>Emissions monitoring data available at plant need to compile information on a calendar month, – similar to Allington plant, from today onwards.</p> <p>There is a snag list and ICE agrees these.</p> <p>FCC will move into the office next week. Some small site offices will remain to complete the snag list.</p> <p>Majority of landscape completed.</p> <p>The carpark for constructions site staff to be re-instated.</p> <p>Construction loan to be paid by Buckinghamshire County Council CC in this week - full value of the loan.</p> <p>Question raised; Any comfort driver facilities, vehicles are pulling up early in the morning.</p> <p>Gillian Sinclair Response; There is facilities for the drivers to use at the weighbrige.</p>
