

| 1.   | <p><b>Attendance, Minutes of Previous Meeting</b></p> <p>No comments received</p>   |
| 2.   | <p><b>Matters Arising</b></p> <p>Gillian Sinclair still to speak to Nick Payne re the pond.<br/>           FCC currently reviewing the works with the ecologists. Regrassing of flattened area and clearing of the damage caused by BT work is now completed.</p>   |
|      | <p><b>Questions raised in advance of the meeting;</b></p> <p>None received</p>  |
| 3.   | <p><b>Site Report<br/>Operations</b></p> <p>The annual outage for planned maintenance took place from 13<sup>th</sup> May to end of month. Greatmoor was subsequently offline for a further week. This was due to the need to replace a number of refractory line tiles in the boiler. However as the outage period available was for longer than used, we were still within the planned outage period.</p> <p>During outage no complaints about odour were received, there were no unforeseen issues with the facility and we hope to operate right through to May 2018.</p> <p>Over the last quarter<br/>           60,000 tonnes of waste received<br/>           39MW/hours of electricity production (26MW average rate)</p> <p>The figures are lower than previous months due to outage period</p> <p>Chris Mitchell (Environment Agency) has visited twice during the quarter. No complaints received by EA.</p> <p>There was one minor breach – on start up after outage there was a 3 hour period where emissions were not measured.</p> <p>Training had subsequently been delivered to staff in operations, maintenance and management to ensure checks are in place for future.</p> <p>FCC confirmed that a separate EA permit is required for the TWAO application.</p> |

|                          | <p><b><u>Emissions</u></b></p> <p>May – higher than expected maximum value to TOC (65% of limit), and daily figure for CO (40%) – due to a fan tripping, causing combustion to increase for a couple of minutes</p> <p>June – HCl max figure of 58.33 (half hour limit) and 90% (daily limit) due to differential filter in bag house failing. Again this was an issue for a few minutes only.</p> <p>Quarterly monitoring of dioxins, furans and heavy metals has become 6 monthly from June. |      | <p>Outreach Visits – currently carrying out many outreach visits mainly to schools, but some to adult groups (eg WIs)</p> <p>Q – How was open day publicised? It was publicised on Greatmoor website and Bucks Herald.</p> <p>Future dates will be sent to parish councils for newsletter publication.</p> <p>Roger Seed mentioned that Greatmoor had won the Design of Waste Facility category in the national Let’s Recycle Awards in May.</p>   |
| 4.   | <p><b>HS2</b></p> <p>The Public Enquiry starts on Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> July, and will run for 3-4 days depending on representations, which are trying to delay due to East/West Rail. HS2 are increasingly keen due to issues with East/West Rail. The Public Inspector will carry out a site visit during the public enquiry. The visit will be the same as FCC provided for Mr Webster and Cllr MacPherson.</p> <p>East/West Rail will not be decided until next year, but then HS2 works will have been started at Calvert</p> <p>Natural England and BBOWT are concerned about the long term management. Mitigation works will need bat licences. This is in draft form and agreed with NE. A management agreement (under NERC Act 2016) has been agreed– NE can step in to force HS2 to undertake monitoring, with landowners having responsibility for the work.</p> <p>NE believe the HS2 methodology is good within the licence however BBOWT are less convinced</p> <p>BCC (Specifically Cllr MacPherson), Charndon, Calvert Green and Steeple Claydon PC’s have all been very supportive of the amended application. There is also support from Cllr Tett at BCC. Cllr MacPherson will make representation at the PI on behalf of the residents she represents.</p> <p>Q – What is the compound on Gawcott Road?<br/>A – HS2 compound</p> <p>Q – Are HS2 still only using the access road to move one transformer?<br/>A – Yes that is still the case</p> |
