1.	Attendance, Minutes of Previous Meeting The minutes of the last meeting were agreed
2 & 3	Matters Arising / Site Report 95% availability 110,000t of waste combusted 81,500 MWh electricity generated Greatmoor was offline in May outage period. The outage was very succesful with no major issues HSE visited in December – no issues raised 33KV export cable has been moved due to changes required by HS2. The southern mound has slippage on it and remedial engineering works started at the end of May and will continue to September Planning permission was granted in February for increased vehicle movements on the access road. Limit is now 300 vehicles per day. Current levels are 150-200, with no expectation that this will increase in the next six months HS2 are considering using the access road. FCC believe that HS2 do not have the power to use the access road except for the agreed movement of the transformer. FCC believes that HS2 would need to revise its environmental statement. FCC do not have any details of vehicle numbers from HS2. FCC believe that HS2 will need planning permission from BCC. Kingswood PC petitioned against HS2 using the access road. However some villages away from the A41 are keen for the use of the access road to go ahead.
4.	Emissions Report The half-hourly and daily Continuous Emissions Monitoring data was shown for whole of 2018 and up to the current date for 2019. Data dor Dioxins and Furans, heavy metals, Mercury and Hydrogen Fluoride taken periodically were also presented. All results for 2018 and 2019 year to date were shown to be well within lmits set in permit In 2018 – 2 remaining improvement conditions set within the permit were completed.

	Particulates peaks led to shutdown periods in January and February to allow for corrective actions and compliance to be ensured throughout the period. BREF - Best Available Techniques Reference Document is being reviewed in Europe and the outcomes will apply to the UK. Permits will then have to be varied with a lowering of emissions limits for all existing EFWs. In general Greatmoor has performed within the future standards although further optimisation may be required for NOx. <u>Questions</u> Can we quantify the weight of total emissions over a year? - Yes – these are submitted to Pollution inventory held by EA, the data is published on the Environment Agency website each year and the submission can be made available for the next CLG meeting Has there been a significant change in the waste from BCC due to changes in times and closures of HWRCs - There has been no increase in volume, quality or types of waste from BCC to Greatmoor, if anything a slight decrease. The calorific value of the waste at Greatmoor has stayed consistent, the CV would fluctuate if the amount of plastic varied - There has been no increase in flytipping in the county. There has been a decrease in waste at HWRCs.
5.	Visitor Centre Since last meeting 86 visits 1215 visitors 4654 visitors in total and expecting 5000th before end of June 18 outreach visits to 191 adults and 883 under-16s Phoenix Sculpture is finished and in storage – waiting for agreement for location “Drawing Greatmoor” Art Course in November very successful and looking to repeat this year
