Actions Arising:

Action	Description
1.	Mobile Mast – A Macpherson to contact BCC/Satelite Providers for advice. FCC no action. Some discussions – Highly unlikely a mast will go on the stack – this will not take the weight of this. There would be a great cost and difficult to achieve. A dish was proposed – this is still not possible due to airflow and will have loading effect on the stack. Wind direction could be a significant effect. Paul Firth said it would benefit the community, proposal was to put on the building. If the supplier visits the site we can see if this is feasible or not. Quainton will not benefit from this after some research. IJ to be contacted by Village Networks to understand location and feasibility.
2.	Road Sweeper – use of water and turning this off. J Lister to advise Contractor to use with care and switch off water after use. Sweeper contract is with D&M we have seen the licence with Thames Water for accessing this hydrant. Dropping pressure at cottages, and they have been told about this.
3.	Carbon Emissions – P Alvarez to investigate and give findings at next meeting. IJ to check with PA to get an update on this. PA to circulate information to the group for this.

1.	Attendance, Minutes of Previous Meeting The minutes of the last meeting were agreed.
2 & 3	Matters Arising / Site Report Operational Update 2 breakdown events that resulted in the facility to be shut down. January 100% availability, also good February. Historically there is a reduction in waste before Christmas and excess after.. During this year waste supplies were well managed. 297,000 tonnes of waste processed at the facility for 2019. The facilities main Outage is scheduled for May 2020 avoiding the bank holidays 1 accident occurred in January, a operator hit his head against a glass panel. The accident was very light without any injuries sustained – warning stickers put on glass panel.
4.	Emissions Report 201 was a successful year without any emissions breaches. The annual EA submission has been issued and will be updated onto the website when agreed by the EA. Tom Morrison asked CO2 emissions – how do we fit into zero emissions. Ian Judd replied. Our operating limits are being reassessed, and we are looking to reduce these to attain the regulations. We will continue to operate the plant in line with those limits. This plant was designed to meet our environmental requirements. We have an environmental management team that evaluate any changes in regulations and what modification are required to meet those new limits. Roger Seed response - We will go back to BCC for funding for this – this plant was built to adhere to all the regulations regarding CO2 emissions. Tom Morrison suggested we should recycle more and burn less this is the answer. Roger Seed agreed that we would like to do this. BCC would like to reduce the waste from BCC and the rest of the waste can come from other County Counties. Carbon Audit across the County. Key emissions to be kept down. On local political agenda. Discussions on the type of plastic should be recycled, should speak to supermarkets to change their suppliers of the type of plastics used.

5.	Visitor Centre 52 visits since last meeting 480 adults 155 under 16s 635 total visitors Among these: Action 4 Youth Aspire Pebblebrook Tring School Bucks College Talkback Outreach visits: 11 since last meeting Talks & workshops to schools 2 days at Bucks Skills Show Next 5 weeks very busy including Art Course for the second time. Expecting visitor numbers to exceed 2000 for 2019/20 reporting year. Increase in numbers of visits from schools and colleges. No signs of slowing down on community visits. AM suggested inviting New MP Greg Smith to a visit – Jez to contact Julie Forcade.
6.	Any Other Business David Evershed – Due to HS2 - There will be a 3 yr gap when trains will not be delivering waste here. So what are the implications and plans for this? Ian Judd – we have a budget, so we will look at alternative supplies. We are actively engaging in finding that waste. Which will come by lorry. The London waste was always temporary. We understand that we would replace this with other outside waste. The concern was the additional lorries bringing waste into the facility instead of from the train waste. We would still be well within the permitted transportation of the access road. 600 vehicle movements per day. The concern was that the volumn of the traffic would exceed the movements permitted. Can we work out the number of deliveries – total vehicle movements

	monitoring requested. Figures for the increase of traffic movements. This will not happen in 2021 or not sure if it would happen in 2022. IJ can only quantify the vehicles coming into this facility not any other vehicles. If the County Council has put a limit on the traffic movements – it is the responsibility of the County Council to monitor. HS2 will fall below the threshold. IJ/RS to discuss how we can capture this information. Woodham Industrial Estate also has cement lorries coming into the beginning of the access road – these can not be included in any figures as above. Issue at the roundabout was a small concern. Suggestion was made an automatic number plate recognition should be used to monitor the lorries coming into the access road. RS said there would be additional costs. Operational times brought up as could be breached but not monitored. Issue for BCC/Highways Roger Seed to advise – Action. Suggestion made that we should name the roundabout. Pheonix scupture – not going on roundabout, planning, road safety etc complications, we haven't got an answer how to manage this so in conclusion, this will go at front of the building possibly. Put on hold at this time. The Mound Will be reseeded as soon as weather permits. Date of Next Meeting – 18th June 2020 (National Clean Air Day) New councillors 11th May 2020.
