1.	HS2 Representative from FCC request to attend next meeting. SR to arrange.

Item	Minutes
1.	Minutes of Previous Meeting The minutes of the last meeting were agreed.
2.	Matters arising COVID – visit by new MP not possible at this time. JF been in touch with their office and will advise of potential for visit.
3.	Operational Update SR shared slides. Injuries during September. RIDDOR employee fell over a hosepipe and fractured his arm. 1 Contractor had accident due to lime pipe spillage. Availability – purple is planned outage. Intend a small outage next week to repair small issues. Waste burnt 26,341 Tonnes. Fuel Oil used 110,539 ltrs. Used due to outage and 'curing' of new refractory lining.. Contract Waste Received at HH – due to covid more waste being generated. More packaging from deliveries to homes. No comments on the operations from members of the meeting.
4.	Emissions information Carbon offset explained by SR – less going to landfill. PA shared slides Permit Compliance – emissions measured every half hour. Summarised – overall no issues. 100% compliance. Daily average limits 100% compliant. AM asked. What level of reduction is going to be implemented. Reductions on all – combustions stay the same. Slides will be available for all attendees of the meeting.
5.	Visitor Centre No visits due to COVID restrictions. Slides shared by JE and explained. Annual Visitors April-March. From March 9th visits cancelled.

	Visitors Annually on a normal year Apr – Mar we would have exceeded the 2000 visitors mark if COVID had not happened. Discussed return of visits. Not likely, until well into 2021. Schools have had online sessions as these have gone really well. Some minor school IT issues. JE will promote this through website. Improvements for visitors centre – interactive white boards one idea/option. AM – thanked JE on this as he has adapted to COVID.
6.	Any Other Business Vehicle Movements – Council granted increased vehicle movements. 600 is our permit we have around 300, we are well below our daily usage rate. HS2 Taken over several areas from end- Sept – compulsory purchase of the land adjacent to the access road. If they use our access road must not impede on our use. We are awaiting a report from HS2 but we have been told it will not increase the load on the road, they will keep into our limits of 600 moments. We have had concerns and have asked HS2 for traffic management report. AM asked - When do we stop using the train. SR replied from Mar 2021 for upto 3 years. JC asked a question regarding replacing the North London Waste and if there will there be a shortage of waste. SR replied definitely not, in fact more likely to be an increase. New bridleway being created PG concerned about access to the site. SR explained HS2 will be using laydown area only when they have shown that they have a workable traffic management plan.. Requested FCC representative for HS2 to attend next meeting. SR will ask this person. Grendon Underwood – KM no comments. AM thanked JE regarding helping with clearing the bridleways. Absences – AM raised concern that the Landfill part of the meeting was not present, no attendance by JL. JL was on leave when meeting date arranged, so gave his apologies. AM asked that this is not absent from the next meeting. FCC Updates Information given by SR and slides shown.

	Rights of Way – Bridleways 41 & 46 south of the land referred to Carters Lane. Turns into another right of way No 24. Overgrown, works are in place to clear this. AM suggested annually suggested due to wildlife. SR suggested bi-annually, but agreed to annual clearance. Bridge bridleway closed due to public safety Poor state of repair. We have had to revisit as HS2 have compulsory purchased half of the bridge FCC are in discussions with them. NHS – Remote working We have offered facilities, although we are a bit off the beaten track. Community Employer FCC have 2 apprenticeships recruiting shortly. Kickstart Govt Scheme in place – we have offered to pay national living wage rather than the minimum wage. We are in partnership with BC to be involved in this scheme. SCE – complimented FCC on this. COVID Testing FCC Greatmoor have purchased COVID kits to take the burden off the NHS.
