Operations – Landfill and Quarry Backfill (QBF - Pit 6)

Main activities

- Non hazardous Landfill – remains mothballed
- Restoration continues – Soils placement
- Bottom Ash processing continues in the QBF
- Non-hazardous soil imports by road in QBF

Secondary Activities

- Gas Utilisation – continues
- Leachate Treatment –continues to treating leachate on site.



Engineering Works

- Permanent/Temporary Capping

Capping Programme to start March and ended 1st May 2026 covered 31,020m²

- Surface Water Management

Lagoons and pumping system in place, monitoring daily



Developments

- Solar park planning application (for a solar farm located on the landfill restored area) Still with Infinis TBC Email received 30th September 2025 from Jason McGray Head of Development for Infinis. Being reviewed this year 2026.
- FCC's restoration scheme will be amended to accommodate the solar panels for the next 35 years, and then it will revert to the current approved scheme
- Train Sidings ongoing by HS2 potentially trains to return in 2028 TBC



HS2

- Ongoing, works continue with regular meetings between FCC, HS2 and EKFB.

Other issues

- Trespassing on FCC land accessing near Sandstone Close, Fence keeps getting repaired
- Vandalism of FCC Leachate Tanks, Gates, and Fences, including Infinis KOP, Wells
- Crime numbers have been issued by the police, ongoing
- Mains Power to be connected TBC, by Brackley Lane Gate
